Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I feel privileged to welcome you all on behalf of our beloved Association to this auspicious 91st Annual State Conference.

I also welcome the new entrants to our Service as well as to our Association. At the same time I also want to convey my sincere and warm gratitude to those who have returned to our Association.

We are aware that the Association has been working for the development and well being of the members. We feel proud to say that the members are also trying always to raise the prestige and dignity of the Association both to the Government by way of fulfilling the target set before them and also at the same time to the public by providing improved service to them. The revenue collected by our Directorate during the last financial year i.e. 2010-11 is Rs.2418 Crore which is 25% higher than the previous year's collection and this growth rate is highest among the revenue generating wings of the Government. This proves how sincere our members are at their workplace.

A cultural programme was organised by us on the 5th day of September, 2010. "Aatpoure Rabindranath", a tribute of us to Rabindranath Tagore on his sesquicentennial birth anniversary, was played by some invited artists. Later the drama "Mayur Mahal" was staged by the members of our Association.

Like previous years, this year also we organised a seminar on the 10th April, 2011 at the Office of the Registrar of Assurances, Kolkata to train the new entrants as well as to refresh the mind of our old members on several Acts and Rules related to our day to day works. We have been greeted by the participants marvellously and the seminar was really a grand success.

It is also a matter of proud that some of our members actively participated in the initiatives taken by the Government to amend the Indian stamp Act, 1899 and the Registration Act, 1906 and also participated in the discussion held at Hyatt Regency, Kolkata and also at other places courageously.

The Association is always placing our demands to Government and putting pressure for fulfillment of the same. Due respect has been given by the Government to some of our demands in the previous year, notably-

1. An order of promotion and transfers of the officers of our Service was issued in the month of January. This time the officers, who were promoted, got an opportunity to join in their new position on the due date of promotion,
2. Two new A.D.S.R. offices have been opened, one at Tarakeswar in the district of Hoogly by bifurcation from A.D.S.R., Haripal, and another at Mal in the district of Jalpaiguri by bifurcation from A.D.S.R., Moynaguri,
3. The modified form of Annual Confidential Report (ACR) i.e. Self Appraisal Report (SAR) has been introduced for the members of our service from this year i.e. 2010-11. All the members are requested to submit the SAR to his/her reporting officer in time,

4. All the eligible members have got the benefits under MCA Scheme, 2001 except one or two cases. We have brought it to the notice of the Government and we expect that they will get it soon,
5. Services of all eligible members services of the members who have passed the departmental examination and have completed two years of service has been confirmed according to the West Bengal Services (Training. & Examination) Rules, as amended in 2009. Those, whose services have been confirmed, have got the second increment also,
6. During the last one year Computerised Registration System has been introduced in five Registration Offices, etc.

We have submitted some exhaustive memoranda before the Government on the following items:

1. Creation of two posts in Scale no. 18 as DIGR, one in Nadia and another in Purba Medinipur
2. Declaration of our Service as an integrated Service,
3. Award of scale linked designation to the members of our service,
4. Creation of four posts, one in the rank of DIGR and another three in the rank of DR, for e-Records and Analysis Centre,
5. Making arrangement for a computer with internet facility for each office,
6. Making provision for mobile phone for the members,
7. Issuance of order of promotion from SR to ADSR,
8. Bifurcation of heavily loaded offices, etc.

The demands are in active consideration of the Government and we are expecting positive results within a short period.

As a member of the Convention of State Services Association, West Bengal, a joint forum of the Associations of Group-A Officers under our State Government, our Association actively participated in the activities of the Convention, like press conference held at the Press Club etc. Some proposals regarding administrative reforms have also been placed before the Government.

The summary of receipts and expenditure for the year 2010-11 has been duly audited by our Auditor and the related papers will be placed before you by our Treasurer just after this for inspection and reference.
